Headteacher's Update

Hello



I would firstly like to sincerely thank parents/carers, who really supported a reduction in potential transmission of Covid-19 in the lower junior phase of the school, through ensuring close contacts had a PCR test last weekend. Hopefully you would agree that it is sensible to sustain our outbreak management plan, as shared with you on Monday, until half term. This break will then support a stabilization, with transmission in school not being an option for the virus. Next week, we are hoping to see Mrs C Greenwood (Class 7), return to school. Reception teachers Miss Griffiths and Mrs N Greenwood do require a longer recovery period. Miss Griffiths may not return to school this term, whereas Mrs Greenwood may be able to return at the start of November. I continue, as I know you do, to send all of our children and staff with, or recovering from, Covid-19, our love and best wishes.

I am sorry that the staffing challenges we have been experiencing have impacted on some of our parents/carers' and teacher meetings. I hope those of you whose appointments stand, find them useful, and all outstanding, postponed appointments will be rearranged after half term. In a roofing update, I can inform you that the new expected end date for the works is Tuesday 23rd November. Delays have been caused by both Covid-19 and challenges around distribution of materials. This week we learnt about **turtles**. Ask your child what interesting facts they can remember! A highlight for us was during a drama session later in the week. The children listened to an under the sea sound scape and explored what it would be like to play under the sea like a turtle. The children impressed us with how carefully they considered their movements when travelling like a turtle and this continued into their child initiated play in the outdoor classroom.



We listened to the story of the turtle and the changing sea. The children showed empathy when hearing of how rubbish was destroying the home of so many sea creatures. This story provoked an interesting discussion into how we could look after the world around us better. The children shared their knowledge of recycling boxes at home and how they have previously donated toys to charities. We are very proud of how the children care and want to look after the world around them.

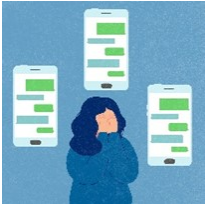

Lower Key Stage 2 (Years 3 & 4)

The Year 3 and 4 children, both in school and at home, have risen to the challenges presented to them and we are extremely proud of how they have worked.

After designing our cartouches last week using hieroglyphics, we had great fun creating our own out of clay in school. After rolling out and cutting the clay to form the shape of a cartouche, we modelled the hieroglyphic images and attached them to our background. The children did amazingly well and manipulated the clay brilliantly to create detailed cartouches. The children at home have also been super creative and created their own cartouches out of materials such as play dough. We have been very impressed with the outcome!



As part of PSHE, the children have been learning about cyberbullying. We discussed the different forms of online bullying and how the children should respond if they, or a friend, ever experience online bullying. To further raise their awareness, the children created posters to highlight the four steps to stay safe against cyberbullying.

Well done Year 3 and 4, you have had another super week and worked extremely well!

Upper Key Stage 2 (Years 5 & 6)

This week in English, we have been learning how to take effective notes about mammals in preparation for writing a non-chronological report. We have been building up our vocabulary bank linked to this topic to enable us to use this technical vocabulary accurately.



As part of our science topic, we learnt about the process of metamorphosis. We now understand the varying stages involved within these transformations as part of life cycles. We were particularly surprised by the transition of amphibians.

In computing, we have begun to write our own algorithms to program a traffic light simulation. We found out the sequence involved was more complicated than we first thought.

We've a huge canvas for people to doodle and draw memories, reflections and words of respect. Add a poppy, be inspired by our display and archive or something else.

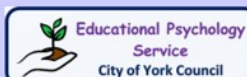
