#### Covid-19 Test & Trace

In a change from pre-September 2021, schools no longer carry out contact tracing; this is completed by NHS Test and Trace only. Therefore, if your child is deemed to be a close contact, you will be contacted directly by them in the days following a confirmed positive PCR test. It is also important therefore to emphasise that if your child does test positive for Covid-19, you must inform NHS Test and Trace of the children your child has been in contact with at school.

As per updated guidance (from 16<sup>th</sup> December) any pupils, aged 5 and over, identified by NHS Test and Trace as a contact, are advised to take daily Lateral Flow tests for 7 days. Results should be reported online, to <a href="https://www.gov.uk/report-covid19-result">https://www.gov.uk/report-covid19-result</a>. If any of these tests are positive they should self-isolate and parents/carers are to then work with Test and Trace to identify their contacts. As long as they are testing negative, and not showing any symptoms, children can continue to attend school during this 7-day testing period.

If your child does test positive for Covid-19, please notify us at school as soon as you can. It is vital that we are able to monitor numbers of cases effectively and respond in a timely fashion as appropriate. You can inform us via our online absence reporting form at any time, including over the festive break (click here). Thank you.

As Christmas is getting closer, children and young people all over the country will be writing lists to Santa or giving hints about what they would like under the tree.



Technology is now an extremely popular item on many children's lists with tablets, smartphones, game consoles and smartwatches likely to be asked for this year.

Whilst we want children to enjoy their presents, it is also important that parents/carers look at ways to ensure that their children use these devices safely. This includes setting parental controls and understanding that video games have PEGI ratings similar to the classification for films. Other things that you may want to consider is managing screen time so that you can monitor the amount of time being spent on each device. This is useful for meal times or during the school holidays.

Finally, once the tinsel has come down and we welcome the New Year, please make sure that you talk to your children about online safety.


After all our hard work this autumn term, we all enjoyed having the opportunity to relax and spend time with friends across both year groups during our Christmas party.
