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#### Headteacher's Message

#### Good afternoon

Again today, Ralph Butterfield Primary School children have shown their genuine care for others, enjoying a break from school uniform to support fund raising for the Comic Relief Charity. It can sometimes feel, particularly in recent times, that there isn't always a lot to laugh about. Children are brilliant for reminding everyone to laugh – and laughter is great for supporting positive mental health. 'Red Nose Day' raises money to help end child poverty; Comic Relief also gives support to a number of organisations helping those affected by the situation in Ukraine.

On Monday of this week, our school assembly raised awareness of the nine protected characteristics. As in our equality objectives statement (also on our website), we also recognise in school that social mobility and socio-economic status can be a factor in discrimination and prejudice. It is a joy how respectful, knowledgeable and understanding the children are around diversity themes and the importance of equality in society.

Next week, the 21<sup>st</sup> March, you may already be aware, is International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination. The children will have further opportunity to explore the importance of equality and celebrating the numerous differences that make us all unique and special, whilst sharing the commonality of all being a human being.

Our Year 5 children enjoyed an assembly with Matt Messias this week, our visiting wellbeing coach; we are looking forward to Year 5 establishing a team of wellbeing ambassadors in the summer term and the ideas they may have about how this could have a positive impact for our younger children.

We are apparently due some more sunshine this weekend. If that is the case, I do hope you are able to enjoy some of it.

#### **EYFS**

A big thank you for all the pots you have been sending in. We planted our cress heads yesterday and will continue with more planting next week. We look forward to our 'hair' growing.

In literacy this week, the children made some fantastic minibeast books, writing facts about different garden creatures.

In phonics this week, the children went over previously learnt sounds and tricky words and used them in their reading and writing.



In our creative session this week, we read the story 'Oliver's Vegetables' and chatted about the vegetables in the story. We then looked at a radish, carrot, broccoli, butternut squash, aubergine, white potato, red potato and beetroot. The children then drew the vegetables and coloured them in using a selection of chalk pastels. It was very exciting to see how the colours smudged together! The pictures were really good and lovely observational skills used.

We have been comparing numbers to 10. In our outdoor maths session this week we sorted the dominoes. Which domino has the most spots? Which has the fewest? Can you find two dominoes that have the same number of spots? Then we sorted the



dominoes into those that had 6 spots and those that had more than or fewer than 6 spots.

For our Red Nose Day maths, we compared amounts of red noses, it was lots of fun looking at the different red noses from over the years.

#### Key Stage 1 (Years 1 & 2)

What a fantastic Science Week we have had! First, we had a trip to Mars... We researched information about the planet and then used question sentences to find out more detail. We then designed our

own alien that could be found on Mars and wrote a character description, using expanded noun phrases, adjectives and conjunctions... as well using the scientific vocabulary we had learnt.

> Beg We then participated in a live lesson to learn about the life cycle of a chicken! As a class, the children worked together to make notes in preparation for writing an explanation to describe the life cycle.

During the week, in PSHE lessons, we have been learning about different career paths and jobs which adults choose to do. For example, the children thought about the skills they would need to be able to be a vet, paramedic or a social media influencer.

The children also thoroughly enjoyed a visit from Mr Crundwell, who spoke to them all about his job as a telecommunications engineer. They learnt about his career path, the skills he needs and played games to see how elements within telecommunications work. A HUGE thank you to Mr Crundwell for supporting our PSHE theme this week.

#### Lower Key Stage 2 (Years 3 & 4)

It has been a very science orientated week in Lower Key Stage two with lots of fun and exciting activities.

As part of our science topic about rocks, the children made their own dinosaur fossils by using plaster of paris and creating a mould from clay. We were all very excited and couldn't wait to reveal the fossils once they had dried. This was then continued within our English lessons. The children wrote their own set of amazing instructions about how to make a fossil. Their instructions were brilliantly written and really showed off their understanding of the writing features included as well as the technical vocabulary we have been learning about.

Our science week activity was all about 'Growth'. The children learnt lots of facts about Mars and what is needed for an animal to live and grow. They were then set the challenge of de-signing and making their own animal from plasticine that would survive the harsh conditions on Mars. We had many weird and wonderful creations!

In computing, we have been looking at email safety using 2Email on Purple Mash. This has included why we need rules, the advantages and disadvantages of using email, and why we shouldn't share personal information, photos or videos with unknown people online.

It was lovely to see the sea of red that the children dressed in to support Red Nose Day. The children also loved sharing their jokes. What a great way to end the week!



#### Upper Key Stage 2 (Years 5 & 6)



As part of Science Week, the children learnt the necessary features of living organisms. 'MRS GREN' is an acronym often used to help remember all the necessary features of living organisms: Movement, Respiration, Sensitivity, Growth, Reproduction, Excretion and Nutrition. The children then applied this understanding in order to design their own life form that could survive in the harsh conditions on Mars.

We have started to learn about Islam and this week considered how life could be perceived to be a journey. This knowledge was then applied to the children's learning around the sharaiah and they then began an in depth study of the 5 pillars of Islam.





As part of our computing lessons, we are creating our own spreadsheets in order to manage a household's monthly outgoings and incomings. The children will have to apply their prior knowledge and understanding of spreadsheets, that they have learnt over the course of this computing unit, in order to complete the task.
