It has not been easy for the dance group to practise due to illnesses, isolations and staff absences but they took it all in their stride and it didn't phase them.



In phonics this week, we have been applying our knowledge of the sounds we have learnt so far in our writing. It has been a pleasure to see the children's confidence and ability, blossom! The children have been segmenting the sounds in simple –three sound-words. (for example cat, map, pig).





In Maths we have been focussing further upon our maths mastery skills in developing a greater understanding of numbers. We have explored addition to 5 this week using the part whole model. This can simply be created using paper and felt tips at home by splitting any 5 objects you can find – apples,

lego, socks. Use your imagination! How many ways can they make 5?

The children have really impressed us with their enthusiasm in learning the Nativity songs. This week we learnt more about the story of the Nativity. The children have had the opportunity to dress up

and act as characters through provision opportunities. Showing their understanding of the story, the children developed their fine motor cutting skills when making a nativity scene piece of art. The excitement is building for our upcoming Nativity film with each rehearsal that passes, we hope you are feeling the excitement too!

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Key Stage 1 (Years 1 & 2)

EYFS

Lower Key Stage 2 (Years 3 & 4)

It has been another busy and active week for the children in Year 3 and 4. The children completed their shadufs and we have been delighted, not only with the resulting models but the way the children have re-designed and problem solved, as they have worked to complete their models. We have also been pleased to see the cooperation they have demonstrated in supporting each other with the task.



In PSHE lessons this week, the children have been thinking about 'respect' and what it actually means. They decided that it is 'treating others the way we would like to be treated' and they came up with examples of how we can show respect but also thought of examples of how people show disrespect. When discussing things as a class and in groups, they were very good at explaining their

thoughts and ideas clearly showing a good understanding.

In PE, the three classes have been super – active in different ways. Class 6 have been busy competing in a virtual Tri-golf competition and Mrs Petruso has been pleased with how well they have learned the skills and completed the tasks. Meanwhile, Class 8 have continued to work on team building with Mr Stephenson from Total Sports. Class 7 have been enjoying REAL PE lessons with the expert guidance of Mrs Topliss our PE specialist.

Upper Key Stage 2 (Years 5 & 6)

We have been writing persuasive texts in English this week using a range of different techniques: modal verbs, alliteration, metaphors and rhetorical questions. We considered the audience and purpose when planning our leaflets.





In science, we learnt about seed dispersal. We spent some time looking at different methods plants use to ensure that their seeds travel far and wide in order to locate sufficient space, light and nutrients to grow. A particular favourite of the children was the squirting cucumber!

During Interfaith Week, we have considered the faiths in our local and national community. The children understand the importance of celebrating our differences and considered how they could encourage community cohesion by creating a plan for an interfaith event.


Booking School Dinners—Important, please read
