In phonics this week we have practised reading tricky words. These words follow no rules – we cannot blend them, we simply have to learn to sight read them. We have enjoyed playing bingo with these words, writing, reading and finding them in books.

In Maths we have been exploring different shapes. The children painted beautiful Kandinsky inspired artwork using circle and triangle shapes.





The children have been movie stars this week as we began filming their Nativity performances. Their playful characters have shone through in the recordings and we are so pleased and proud of them. The children worked hard on speaking loudly and clearly when delivering their lines. Their singing was fantastic and their dancing would rival that of most of the strictly contestants! We cannot wait to see

## Key Stage 1 (Years 1 & 2)

This week, the Year 1 children have focussed on reinforcing their knowledge of split diagraphs in phonics. As a reminder, split diagraphs make the letter sounds a-e, e-e, i-e, o-e and u-e. They have learnt how important the role of the letter 'e' is in creating the long vowel sound, for example changing an 'a' to an 'ai' sound. The children have enjoyed practising this through a range of games, activities and while reading during the week.

In maths, the children have explored different methods of subtraction using practical equipment to solve calculations and word problems. Everyone worked really well with the Diennes equipment to recognise the value of the number, in order to practically subtract a smaller number.





During the week, the children have really enjoyed exploring colours in our art lessons and learning about primary and secondary colours. Using paints, they have mixed primary colours to create secondary colours and used these to paint colour wheels.

We have also been very excited to be practising for our nativity plays and the acting and singing is progressing well. Next week, we shall be filming the plays and we're looking forward to sharing them with you, once they are edited!

### Lower Key Stage 2 (Years 3 & 4)



This week has been varied and creative in Year 3 and 4. Our history this week has been all about Ancient Egyptian gods and goddess. The children learned about just ten of the about two thousand gods and goddesses who the Egyptians worshipped for different reasons. They then combined the qualities of at least two gods or goddesses to make new deities with the features, responsibilities and powers of both. They certainly came up with some interesting new creations!

In science, classes 6 and 8 have been grappling with food chains and learning about what these are and how to make one. It was quite tricky as they had to know which animals ate plants at the start of the food chain and then which animal ate that and which animal ate that one – it was guite hard at first, but they got there in the end. Class 7 meanwhile, have been having a go at making a set of model human teeth out of red and white plasticine and there were 'smiles' all round when they completed the task.





Our Christmas craft day has been a great success with each class working in turn with each of the Lower Junior teachers to complete a Christmas activity. With Miss Hodgson, the children got to make a wonderful Christmas card, with Mrs Petruso they made different decorations to take back to their own classroom to decorate it and with Mrs Greenwood they made a different decoration to take home with them.

### Upper Key Stage 2 (Years 5 & 6)

In science, we drew the entire life cycle of a flowering plant using our knowledge built up over the last few weeks. The children were able to apply their learning to create an accurate diagram.

In maths, Class 9 are consolidating their division skills in the context of decimals and money whilst Class 10 and Class 11 have begun work on fractions. The children are realising that their times' tables knowledge is crucial in many aspects of mathematics. Continuing to build up fluency and speed in this area is beneficial to all.

The Year 6 pupils welcomed Mr Messias back, who is working with them to guide them in how to be resilient and develop a positive growth mindset. We have additional sessions planned which we hope will support them with their learning over the coming months.
