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Headteacher's Message

Good afternoon

I hope you are looking forward to attending our summer fair – the first for 3 years! I would like to thank our wonderful PTA (we are really fortunate to have such a dedicated, proactive PTA), for the hard work that has gone into organising it. I would also like to thank you, for either helping at, or supporting, this year's fair if you are able to.

I do need to give a loud, special shout out to our Year 6 children, who, despite all of the disruption of the last couple of years, have achieved phenomenal results in their statutory tests (that they took in May). Here is a summary of these very well deserved results, compared to the national average:

Subject	Children achieving expected standard or higher (%)	Children achieving above expected standard (%)
Maths	94% (National 71%)	51%
Reading	94% (National 74%)	53%
Grammar punctuation and spelling	98% (National 72%)	62%
Reading, writing and maths combined	89% (National 59%)	17%

EYFS

For our understanding of the world activity, we investigated how we know dinosaurs lived in the UK and we looked at fossils of plant life as well as dinosaur bones. We also learnt about Mary Anning and her famous dinosaur discoveries in Dorset.

In maths we did more odd and even activities and sharing to consolidate this learning. Our next learning will be counting on when adding and problem solving.

In our literacy this week, we have been enjoying a variety of dinosaur stories and the children have been writing sentences to go with pictures. We have been focussing on making sure our writing makes sense and that we have included finger spaces.



In PE this week, the children have really enjoyed playing a variety of games including 'stuck in the mud', we have also been working in teams throwing bean bags into a hoop and to each other. The children also had opportunities this week to play football with Mr Keaney, which they absolutely loved!

We have had a couple of the Big Cat Phonic reading books returned, thank you. However, if your child still has a reading book at home, they will not be able to take home a new book this week. All the books are numbered and we have a record of all missing books. Please can you ensure all books are in the book bags every Monday. Thank you so much for your help with this.

Key Stage 1 (Years 1 & 2)

In art this week, we have been learning how to make paper sculptures in the style of the famous artists, Lauren Clay, Li Hongbo and Roberto Benavidez. We have had lots of fun experimenting with paper folding, curling, rolling and cutting to create various shapes, sizes and detail, just out of coloured paper! The children then created their own 3D paper sculptures and they look fantastic.



To continue our story writing focus this week, we have designed our own desert islands and planned our own stories using the island as the setting. It has been lovely to see the children use their creative imaginations to plan volcano eruptions, shipwrecks and mermaid tales. The stories are being brought to life through the use of exciting adjectives and conjunctions to add detail and extend sentences.

Lower Key Stage 2 (Years 3 & 4)



Firstly, a HUGE well done and thank you to all the children in Year 3 & 4 for their amazing Music Showcases this week! They all sang beautifully and played their ukuleles brilliantly. We are so proud of the children for their outstanding performances. It was also wonderful to see so many parents and carers back in school for the children's live performances.

In science this week, we have literally 'ramped' things up as the children investigated friction. After learning about friction the children completed a practical investigation. They used ramps with different surfaces and wooden buggies to test the amount of friction caused by each surface type.



Our English this week, was based on writing a WWII recipe. We learnt about recipes as a form of instructions and spent time looking at the layout and features of them. We also learnt about rationing, especially food rationing. The children then took notes whilst their teacher made scones from an authentic Second World War recipe. The notes helped them to write their own fabulous scone recipes.

Queen Elizabeth's Platinum Jubilee

We are pleased to share that each child will today receive a free commemorative book to mark Queen Elizabeth's Platinum Jubilee. The book was commissioned by the UK Government and is published by DK Books.



Designed as an official once-in-a-lifetime commemoration of the Platinum Jubilee and written in collaboration with royal experts and historians, the book tells the story of a young girl, Isabella, visiting her Great Granny Joyce who tells her about the Queen and this year's Jubilee.

In the story, Isabella sifts through Great Granny Joyce's treasure box of souvenirs, which act as introductions to the contents of the book. These include recent and historical events across the United Kingdom and Commonwealth, Inspirational people, landmark innovations and inventions, and a selection of the best art, design, and culture. The book also includes famous quotes from the Queen, facts on the coronation ceremony, content on the lives of famous Commonwealth figures such as Nelson Mandela, notable kings and queens and a timeline of Queen Elizabeth's life.

We hope everyone enjoys reading their special commemorative book and it serves as a keepsake of this special year for Queen Elizabeth II.

10th July 1935 — Annual trip to Scarborough due to attendance merity.

15th July 1937 — School closed—children taken to Yorkshire Show held on the knavesmire.

10th July 1940 — 58 evacuees admitted to school from Middlesboroughschools. School classrooms moved around to allow the evacuees to board at the school.
