


Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS)



This week in phonics, we have revised reading words which have the suffix endings **er** and **est**. An example of these are **sprinter** and **softest**. We have learnt that adding these endings changes the meaning of the words. Adding **er** changes the word from a verb to a noun, for example **print – printer**. Adding **est** changes the word into a superlative which is a word that means the most, for example **soft – softest**. We have also reviewed our Phase 4 learning, prior to carrying out our half-termly assessments next week.

In maths, the children have explored 2D and 3D shapes. They have recalled the names of shapes and some of their properties. For example, a triangle has three sides and three corners. They have enjoyed using shapes to create pictures of dinosaurs and building models.



In our RE lessons this term, we have been learning about belonging. The children began by discussing what teams and groups they belong to. Then they learnt about how Christians know that children are special to God. Then, they have learnt about infant Christian baptism. This week, the children learnt about the Muslim naming ceremony Aqiqah. During the ceremony, the baby has prayers whispered into their ear and money is donated to charities in the name of the baby.



On Wednesday, the children were excited (if also a little nervous) to meet their new teachers for Year 1. They all returned from their transition visits with smiles and they were able to share their feelings about what they were looking forward to next year. We shall be talking about this more over the coming weeks and there will also be another chance to visit new classes, next week.

Key Stage 1 (Years 1 & 2)



It has been lovely to enjoy some more summer sun this week but it has also been great to see our wonderful children shining brightly too. This week we have been learning about structures in DT and how engineers use different shapes and materials for their strength and stability. We took a trip to Ethel Ward playground and investigated the play equipment there, seeing how they had been designed and

built to fit the design brief of being safe, strong and fun to use. We saw that a lot of wood and metal was used because they are strong materials and that the structures were made from triangles and rectangles because these are strong, sturdy shapes. We were also interested to learn that the ropes on the climbing frames had metal cores that would not rot and fray as the ropes did. Back in school, we used these same engineering concepts to design our own playground equipment models. We thought about how we could make them strong and the materials we could use when we build them.



As part of our PHSE work looking at money skills, we have started to think about where money comes from and how we can save it. We learned about all the different ways that we can get money (e.g. as gifts or through pocket money). We focused particularly on earning money and how people get paid for doing jobs. We thought about the way that people are selected for jobs and the skills and qualities that they need to be able to do them. We even had the opportunity to apply for jobs that we would like to do. We filled out an application form and explained which skills made us suitable for the role. We talked about how employers hold interviews to select the right people and that the employees then get paid for doing the jobs.



We were so proud of our children on Wednesday when they met their new class teachers and classes on our first transition morning. It was wonderful to reflect on just how far every single child has come this year, whether they are moving into Year 2 or Key Stage 2. It was also lovely to see the children in their new classes getting to know each other and the adults they will be with next year. There will be more transition sessions running over the next two weeks, and activities and support to help the children prepare for next year's classes.


Well done, Key Stage 1. The finish line is in sight so let's make the final 2 (and a bit) weeks the best ever to finish with a bang!

Lower Key Stage 2 (Years 3 & 4)

This week in science, we have continued with our plants topic and looked at the seven life processes: movement, reproduction, sensitivity, nutrition, excretion, respiration and growth. We discussed how these life processes apply to humans, other animals and plants and why each of them are vital to the life of a living creature. Afterwards, we explored the question 'What conditions do cress seeds need to grow?'. To find out, we planned and prepared a comparative test and formed our own predictions. We placed cress seeds on cotton wool in petri dishes and placed one in a sunny area, one in darkness and one in a cold fridge. We withheld water from another and had a control dish so we were able to draw comparisons. From the observations that we have done throughout the week, it is looking like our predictions were correct. The children will continue their observations and form their final conclusions next week.



It was lovely that so many parents / carers could join us on Monday afternoon to celebrate the work that the children have done in history on the Romans. We hope you enjoyed viewing the children's chariots and having a go at writing a short message in Roman script.

As the end of the school year is approaching, we would appreciate all reading for pleasure books to be returned to school by Friday 11th July. Thank you!





THE READING AGENCY Summer Reading Challenge




Summer Reading Challenge launches 12 July!
