

Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS)

Welcome back! It was so lovely to see everyone after their Christmas break. All of the children came back to school with a renewed enthusiasm to learn and with exciting holiday news to share.

Our new theme for this half-term is 'Amazing Animals'. We shall be taking a journey around the world to explore different habitats and meeting the animals who live there. More information about this half-term can be found on our school website in the Reception classes' page.





In **phonics** this week, the children were excited to begin to learn a new set of phonemes. The new phonemes are digraphs (two letters which make one sound) and trigraphs (three letters which make one sound) and these are ai, **ee, igh** and **oa**. We have also learnt the catchphrases for each grapheme. These help us to remember the phoneme (sound) that each grapheme (the way the phoneme is written) makes. For example, the catchphrase for ai is 'tail in the rain'. We have also continued to consolidate the phonemes and tricky words already learnt in the autumn term.

In maths this week, the children have investigated mass and capacity. They have compared mass and capacity and also used non-standard units to measure. This included measuring the mass of everyday objects with multilink cubes. The children have also enjoyed measuring the capacity of different sized containers using water. They have also learnt new vocabulary, for example, heavier, lighter, full and empty.

Mass and Capacity





This week, our topic has focussed on the Polar Regions. This has included learning about which animals live there and where the Polar Regions are in the world. The children have particularly enjoyed reading our text of the week, 'Poles Apart'; inspiring children to create their own polar bear, using fork painting, write captions and labels based on our text and play the 'Where do I live?' and the 'Penguin Pairs'

games.

In PE, we have started working with Mr Walton (our school PE specialist teacher) and our PE lessons will be on Thursdays each week. Each week, he will be teaching the children an introduction to gymnastic skills. This includes rolls, gymnastic shapes, balances and investigating using floor and small and large gymnastic equipment.

Key Stage 1 (Years 1 & 2)




Happy New Year and welcome back to school. We hope that you had a relaxing, well-earned break. It was lovely to see all of the children back in school this week. They certainly came back ready to make a strong start to the year ahead!

We started the term by looking at our big question, "what does it mean to be me?" This question was linked to the British value of mutual respect and of celebrating the things that make each person unique. We read the story of The Ugly Duckling and discussed how the characters in the story did not respect his differences and the effect this had on him. But those differences ended up being wonderful and special. We made some swans and ducklings of our own in art.

We linked our work in English to this story too, using adjectives and adverbs in our sentence writing to describe the duckling. We focussed on describing not only his appearance but also his character and behaviour. We used adverbs to describe the way, for example, that he moved. The children had some brilliant ideas.





In maths, we have been revising our knowledge and understanding of place value and the number system. We investigated 2-digit numbers and partitioned them into tens and ones, describing what each digit in the number represented. We also learned about fractions of shapes. We investigated a number of different shapes and explored how we could

divide them fairly into halves and quarters. We talked about the need for each fraction to be fair and equal.

We started our new science topic, which is all about everyday materials in the world around us. We started by discussing what materials are and identifying some of the more common types (e.g. wood, metal, plastic, etc.) We also started to identify uses of these materials in and around the classroom.





We would like to remind you of the days that each class does P.E and the need for each child to have the correct, named, kit in school ready for those days. Please be aware that some of these days may be different to last half term. Please also ensure that your child has suitable P.E kit for both indoor and outdoor sessions, as we shall be taking children outside

for lessons during the winter when the weather is fine. The P.E days for each class are as follows:

Lower Key Stage 2 (Years 3 & 4)

What a great start to the new term! Year 3 and 4 have returned to school full of excitement and eager to discover what the term ahead has in store for them.



The RSPB Big School's Bird watch started this week and the Year 3 and 4 children thoroughly enjoyed learning about birds that we may find in our local environment. To begin with, the children viewed a selection of pictures of a variety of birds such as robins, blackbirds, starlings and blue tits and explored fact cards about them to discover the typical size and weight of the birds as well as what they eat. Afterwards, the children headed out onto the field with

their recording cards to see what birds they could spot on school grounds.

This week, the children have considered the meaning of this term's big question, 'What does it mean to me?' This question is linked to the Fundamental British Value 'Mutual Respect'. As part of their learning, the children watched a short clip about mutual respect and how respect can be shown when playing sports. The children clearly defined the term mutual (a feeling or action shared between people) and respect (to treat people politely and thoughtfully, to show we value them) and suggested a great array of words that represented how mutual respect is shown. Each class created a brilliant class word cloud to represent their ideas.





We are all extremely excited to share the fantastic news with you that our Spring Term performance is 'HOODWINKED'. The planning and preparation has begun and the children were eager to take part in auditions for the different roles this week. We can't wait to start rehearsals and begin to learn the songs. We will keep you updated on how the performance is progressing and you will receive further information throughout the term about costumes and the evening performance dates and times.

This half term, all three classes will be taking part in fitness lessons with Mr Stephenson from Total Sports. We are looking forward to taking part in a variety of activities to build up our stamina and fitness levels. Please can you ensure that your child has their outdoor and indoor PE kit in school as we may be outside for some sessions.

Upper Key Stage 2 (Years 5 & 6)



It is wonderful to see everyone again after the Christmas holidays. The children have returned to school eager to continue their learning.

In our P.E. lessons, we have started our dance unit. Throughout the sessions, we will learn to create shapes using our body, develop sequences of movement and learn how to move between these fluently and accurately. We will refine our dance movements by working with a partner considering what we are doing well and where we need to improve.





This week, we have started our RE Unit: What is it like to be Muslim in Britain? We recapped what we already know. For the Year 6 pupils, we reminisced about our trip to York Mosque, this time last year, as well as discussing what we had learnt about Hajj and Sawm. For the Year 5 pupils, we recalled what we had learnt in previous year groups about Allah and the Prophet Muhammed (pbuh). In this unit, we are looking forward to learning about Shahadah, Salah and Zakat in the weeks to come.

In English, we started our work on explanations texts. We looked at existing texts and identified the key features: the use of varied openers, present tense and the use of passive voice. We then looked at a variety of explanation paragraph examples in order to identify cohesive features needed in order for our work to flow and engage the reader. Examples of cohesive features include varying our vocabulary and utilising different sentence openers.
