I am sure you will read in the phase pieces, all about how well the children have settled back into school this year — and they really have. It has been wonderful seeing the enthusiasm towards learning and the fun they have interacting with each other at break and lunch times. It really has been a positive start to the year.

Thank you for your support with the reminders shared in the 'Welcome Back' letter, particularly around uniform, which has been noticeably brilliant, and the healthy snacks at break time. Please be aware that we do allow assistance dogs on the playground and you may see one of these sometimes.

Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS)

We are really pleased with how all the children in Reception are settling into their new school and classes. It has been a pleasure to be greeted by all the warm smiles each morning and the children are enjoying exploring all of the Reception areas.





This week, we began our phonics journey and started learning the letter sounds for s, a, t and p. You can view the pronunciations they will have learnt for each of these letters by using this link https://youtu.be/-ZtjFIvA_fs The children have also begun to write these letters by learning a short rhyme (mnemonic). Please refer to your child's home learning sheet, for help with these. We look forward to continuing our phonics learning next week.

In PSED (Personal Social Emotional Development), the children have discussed our school community. There are lots of adults and children to meet. As part of this, the children all went on a walk 'beyond the hall'. We visited classrooms and said hello to children and adults. We all really enjoyed visiting Mrs Clark in her office!



We are really proud of how calmly the children have chosen and eaten their lunches offers since starting school. They have enjoyed following the new routines and trying new foods. Beef burgers and carrot cake were particular favourites!

In our areas of provision, the children have enjoyed creating pictures of their families, having their eyes tested in our role play opticians, building structures in the outdoor large construction area and learning how to use our sand kitchen. To develop their fine motor skills, the children have also been practising threading skills.



This week, your child has brought home a 'Reading for Pleasure' book and a scheme reading book. The 'Reading for Pleasure' book is for you to enjoy reading together at home. These are changed weekly, on a Monday. The scheme reading books are Keeps currently wordless. While sharing this book with your child, please discuss the picture and what the children can see. They can also use the pictures to make up

stories. Both books are due back on Mondays, each week, please.




Key Stage 1 (Years 1 & 2)

Welcome back to a new school year everyone! It has been so exciting to be able to welcome our new Key Stage 1 classes. We have all been so impressed by how quickly all of the children have settled into their new routines and the effort



that they have put into their learning. It has already been an exciting two weeks and we are all so full of optimism for what this new school year will bring.



We started this week with a bang: an exciting day to launch our new topic. We enjoyed the story "Bog Baby" by Jeanne Willis, which is about two girls who discover a magical creature on their trip into the woods. In the story, the girls rescue the Bog Baby and care for it... before realising that the kindest thing to do is to release it back into its home. We spent the day doing all sorts of fun activities, including going on a Bog Baby hunt on the field and using compass points to describe where we found the different

illustrations from the story. We had great fun making Bog Babies out of clay and decorating them with twigs and leaves that we collected from the school grounds. We also created a habitat model for them, which involved painting the inside of a shoe box and then decorating it with leaves, pebbles and shells.

In English this week, we recounted our topic launch experience and wrote about what we did, how we did it and which parts we enjoyed the most. It was clear that the children had loved the day because their writing showed how excited the children were starting this new topic.

On Friday we got musical. The Year 1s all came together to do music with Mr Merrall and Mrs Atkinson. We were learning to "find the beat" to a piece of music; this involved clapping and moving in time to different songs and pieces of music. The children enjoyed moving like different animals as they followed the pulse of the music. The Year 2 children had their very first recorder lesson with Mrs Freitas. Learning a new instrument for the first time is very tricky but the children did so well and impressed us all with their determination. We are all looking forward to seeing how they get on!



Thank you very much to all of the parents who have ensured that the children have all of the things that they need for school and that any items of clothing are named in case they get separated from their owners. We would like to take this opportunity to remind you that all children need an indoor and outdoor PE kit in school at all times. We have also started to send home Little Wandle reading books and homework books. Class 4 and Class 5's 'reading for pleasure' books will be sent home on a Friday, whilst Class 3 will bring their 'reading for pleasure' books on a Monday. Please can we ask that

all reading books and homework are returned the following week. If you are unsure about anything to do with home learning then we are here to help! We are always around before and after school to answer any of your questions and further information can be found in the homework letter that was sent out this week.



Well done Key Stage 1! It is fabulous to see you all back in school safe and happy and we are looking forward to continuing our learning adventure together!

Lower Key Stage 2 (Years 3 & 4)

Year 3 and 4 have had a fabulous start to the school year! The children have been full of enthusiasm and have thoroughly enjoyed the start of our new topics.

The ZONES of Regulation

The children have had the opportunity to revisit their learning all about the Zones of Regulation which, as you may remember, were first introduced to all classes throughout the school last academic year. They were able to recall the 4 different coloured zones involved and the varying types of emotions each one represents. They discussed that there is no one 'right' zone to be in but that it is important to recognise and effectively manage their own feelings at different times throughout the day, both at school and whilst at home. In their classes, they brainstormed a range of strategies they could use to help us move from one zone to another when necessary to do so. These included reading a book, listening to music, exercising or taking some deep breaths.

In history, there was certainly no tutting, as the children were very excited to discover that they are going to be learning all about the Ancient Egyptians in the coming weeks. The first task was to find out what, if anything, they already knew about this period in history and then, of course, what they really were looking forward to finding out. The children really impressed us with their wide range of interesting and thoughtful questions, which, hopefully, they will be able to discover the answers to by the end of the topic. Using their chronological awareness from previous history learning, such as the Stone Age and the Romans, they were also able to accurately place the Ancient Egyptians on a timeline.

This half-term, the children are very fortunate to be having one of their weekly Physical Education lessons taught by either Mr Stephenson or Mr Walton, who are both specialist P.E. teachers. The focus will be on developing a range of football skills including passing and receiving, running with the ball and shooting. As well as this, they will be improving their tactical awareness and team work skills within small sided game situations. As the

grass is often quite wet at this time of year, please can we ask that all children bring a plastic bag to put their outdoor trainers in and a spare pair of school socks.

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Reading books:

Children have now also been allocated a reading book which is appropriate to their current reading level. Unlike the reading for pleasure books, which have a designated return day each week, the children are given the responsibility to ask to change their book whenever they have finished reading it. Similar to the pleasure for reading books, each time it is changed, the child's individual reading record will be updated.

Well done Year 3 and 4 for a great start to the school year! You have settled into your new classes and routines brilliantly.

Key Stage 2 (Years 5 & 6)



We've kicked off our theme, 'Industrial Revolution' by looking at the work of Lowry and recreating his style of character as we begin to study the landscape of cities at the time. After a lesson learning to use sketching pencils, we created some our own versions of Lowry's 'matchstick people' and learnt how to draw perspective.

For the start of the academic year, we have refocused and built on our prior learning of the Zones of Regulation. Throughout the school day, we have opportunities to reflect on how we are feeling and the impact that this has on our well-being. Building on the strategies we have previously learnt, we are continuing to manage our emotions in order to be effective learners.





This week in RE, we started our topic which focuses upon the big question, 'Why do some people believe in God?' We looked at census data for the population of the UK and the variety of responses regarding differing faiths. We learnt about what the terms theist, atheist and agnostic mean.

Hello everyone and welcome back!






