York walk to school week, where schools in the York area compete to see how many children they can encourage to walk, scoot or cycle to school that





This week, in **phonics**, we have revised all of the phonemes which we have learnt over the half-term. This totals twenty and we are extremely impressed with how quickly children have learnt these, are recognising them and are beginning to use them to also sound out and blend words to be able to read. It has been a pleasure to see children getting excited when they have read new words! We are very much looking forward to this continuing.

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Key Stage 1 (Years 1 & 2)

As we near the end of a very long first half term, it is great to still see so much enthusiasm and enjoyment of learning in our Key Stage 1 children. We are keeping very busy as we look to round off an outstanding half term.



In celebration of Black History Month, we have been reading the autobiographical book "Coming to England" by Floella Benjamin, which describes her family's migration to Great Britain after the war and the hardships and adventures that came with it. We were so interested in her story that we found out more about her and wrote fact files to show what he learned. We also had a chance to take part in the "Bad Hair Day" event, in which we shared a Zoom

meeting with children's author John Phillips and illustrator Jennifer Jamieson.

In maths this week, we were learning to subtract numbers by using a number line. We also started to develop our understanding of empty number lines, which is very useful because it can be done on any piece of paper. Some of us found it tricky at first but we displayed the Ralph Butterfield Primary School value of determination and persevered. We also continued our practical work on weight. Having used non-standard units (cubes) to measure the mass of items last week, we learned about why standard units are important because they can be understood by everyone.

We compared the weight of objects against a metal weight and described our results in

We compared the weight of objects against a metal weight and described our results in grams. Some of us even used numbered scales to measure the mass of objects in grams.



In RE, we have begun to learn about Islam. We were fascinated to learn about the 5 Pillars of Islam, the five central values that are important to all Muslims. In particular, we were focusing on how Muslims regard Allah and why the prophet Muhammad (PBUH) is so inspirational to Muslims as a leader and teacher. We looked at the Story of the Crying Camel and what it

teaches us about looking after the world around us. Then we thought about people who inspire us and why.

We only have one more week to go. Well done Key Stage 1. You are working so hard and we are proud of you!




Lower Key Stage 2 (Years 3 & 4)



Another fun week in Year 3 and 4! Last week, as part of our 'Ancient Egyptians', 'All wrapped Up' history topic we designed our cartouches using hieroglyphics. This week, we have thoroughly enjoyed getting our hands dirty and creating our own out of clay. After the children had rolled out their clay and cut it to form the shape of a cartouche, they moulded or scored the hieroglyphs to make a cartouche. The children did amazingly well and manipulated the clay brilliantly. We are all very impressed with the super cartouches they have created!

During our English sessions this week, the children have continued their work based on the story 'The Gold in the Grave'. They began their sequence of lessons by looking at a model text of the whole story and were brilliant at identifying the 5 parts of a story (introduction, build-up, problem, solution and ending). They then recognised the writing featured used within the text fantastically. In following lessons, they continued to focus on using subordinating and coordinating conjunctions and have written detailed paragraphs for each part of the story using some fabulous vocabulary. Well done! We can't wait to finish the stories off next week.





In celebration of Black History Month, the children have delved into the life of astronaut Mae Jemison. The children learnt that she was not only an astronaut but also a doctor, teacher and inventor. Mae's achievements demonstrated the importance of working hard, having self-belief and setting yourself ambitious goals.

Key Stage 2 (Years 5 & 6)



This week in maths, we have continued to explore the four operations: addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.

In Mr Tod's set we have been working through addition and subtraction calculations, including using rounding to estimate an answer before working it out.


Mrs Stephenson's and Mrs Fitzpatrick's group have continued their learning using formal addition and subtraction methods to solve multi-step problems. Additionally, we have been learning to measure and calculate missing angles on a straight line.

In Mr Bennett's maths set, we have focused upon division using short and long formal methods. We have applied this to solving multi-step problems.

This week, newspaper reports have been our focus in English. We have learnt about the features within a newspaper report: headlines, by-lines, introductions, quotations, pictures with captions, writing in the third person and using passive voice. We then focused our research for our newspaper report, using primary and secondary sources, upon children in the workforce during the Industrial Revolution. Our teachers even took on the role of a factory owner



whom we had the opportunity to interview. We will use the notes we have gathered to create our own newspaper article next week.



As part of our science lessons, we recapped, recalled and remembered what we had learnt about flowering plants in Years 3 and 4. We identified key parts of a common flowering plant including the stamen and pistil. We then discussed pollination and the way different parts of the flower are involved in the reproduction process of plants. Next week, we will apply this knowledge as we look at the life cycle of a flowering plant.
