## Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS)

This week, our dinosaur topic has explored fossils. The children have learnt how we know about dinosaurs today and why fossils are such amazing and important finds. During the week, the children have taken on the role of a palaeontologist while digging for dinosaur bones. They



have then used them to create dinosaur skeletons. We have also created salt dough fossils by using a range of natural objects to create the fossil markings. The children have also enjoyed hearing about Mary Anning who was a palaeontologist in Dorset in the 1800s.

The vocabulary we learnt last week, has continued to be used in our understanding the world sessions and while children are discussing dinosaurs. As a reminder, we are focussing on using, **dinosaurs**, **extinct**, **prehistoric**, **fossil** and **palaeontologist**.

This week in phonics, we have read words which have a suffix added to the end of them to change present tense to past tense words. Words with an –ed suffix ending can often be pronounced in different ways. An example of this is **bumped** – this word sounds like it ends with a **t** sound and **grunted** – sounds like it ends with an **id** sound. We also continue to revise and learn how to read and spell the tricky words **the**, **I**, **go**, **no**, **you**, **said**, **so**, **have** and **like**.

In maths, we have continued to practise counting to support with subtraction skills. The children have explored using their fingers, sets of objects and number lines to calculate how many are left. We also determined that when we subtract a number the total gets smaller. This is an important mathematical concept to understand.





The children thoroughly enjoyed our sports day this week. We were very proud of their athletics skills, following instructions and being 'good sports'. Thank you for coming along to watch your child too. They really did enjoy showing you their skills.

### Important Reminder

Next week, **Class 1** will visit Haxby Explore library for the **last time this term**. We are happy for children to exchange their books next week but please ask that you support us by returning the books, when they are due, to any York Explore library.

Class 2 will then have their final visit to the library on Thursday 17th July.

## Key Stage 1 (Years 1 & 2)

What a busy and exciting week it has been in Key Stage 1. It was so lovely to see so many family members and friends come and cheer on our children on Thursday's sports day. I think we can all agree that the children were absolutely fantastic and that the whole event was



enormous fun. There were sprint races, hurdles, javelin throwing, long jumps, bean bag throwing and football challenges: a huge variety of events for the children to display their skills. It was so good to see so many people, children and adults alike, enjoying the sports and cheering everyone on in such a friendly and inclusive way.



As well as taking part in sports day, Class 3 had another big event this week, as they performed their class assembly to the rest of the key stage, EYFS, their siblings and family members. Each child reflected on their year and spoke about their favourite memories and what they have enjoyed about this year. As well as that, they showcased some of the amazing things that they have learnt. The Year 2s performed songs

on the recorder, whilst the Year 1 children sang and played glockenspiels to one of the songs they have learned in music. There was also an opportunity for some of the children to perform jumps that include gymnastic positions, which they have been practising with Mr Walton. They did a brilliant job and it was a fantastic opportunity for them to reflect on the amazing learning journey they have been on this year.

In PHSE, we have started to learn about money skills. This includes where money comes from, how it is spent and the difference between needs and wants. We will be learning to make good choices about what we spend our money on and how to prioritise spending and saving. This week, we learned about the different methods of paying money (cash, credit/debit



cards, bank transfers, etc.) and thought about which we might use for different purposes. We thought about all of the things we would need to spend money on, including for services and utility bills.

What an amazing week it has been. We are all so proud of our wonderful Key Stage 1 children.

## Lower Key Stage 2 (Years 3 & 4)

It has been another busy and exciting week in Lower Juniors.

On Monday, all of the Year 3 children have taken part in a Pedestrian Training session run by York City Council. The children learnt how to cross a road safely remembering to 'Stop, Look and Listen' before making the decision to cross. They also learnt how to cross safely behind a

Stop Look Listen parked car although the instructors told them that this should only be attempted when there is no other safer alternative. Finally, they learnt how to cross at a T junction discussing expertly the potential hazards and all the directions in which you needed to look in before crossing. The children listened really carefully, asked super questions and the instructors were very complimentary about their

behaviour which was lovely to hear. Well done Year 3s!

Back in the classroom, and joined by the Year 4 children, they watched an information video all about keeping safe when crossing the road. It gave them top tips to remember such as making sure shoe laces are fastened, not using their mobile phones or listening to music with hoods up. The children were also reminded about things in our communities that can help them cross busier roads safely including zebra, pelican and even puffin crossings as well as footbridges and traffic islands. Finally, the children revisited how to use an electronic railway crossing safely.

Earlier in the week, in preparation for Key Stage Two Sports Day on Friday morning, the children have been busily practising a range of events which include javelin throwing, standing long jump, bean bag throwing, sprinting and hurdles. The relay teams have also been practising their event and trying really hard not to drop the baton! On Friday, we were lucky with the weather and the children had the opportunity to showcase their array of sporting talent. The children thoroughly enjoyed participating in the multiple events, and although it was a house competition, all the children showed fantastic sportsmanship towards each other and were very supportive of their team mates. An additional well done to Ebor who were the overall winning house at the end of the Key Stage Two Sports Day. It was lovely to see so many adults at the event and we hoped you very much enjoyed it!

Just a quick reminder, that this coming Monday (30<sup>th</sup> June) is the Lower Junior 'Open Classroom' event starting at 2:50pm. We hope lots of you will be able to attend and see what the children have been up to in history this term!


